### Resolution #17.286

#### RESOLUTION FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS

#### BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Allamakee County, Iowa;

That pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 317 Code of Iowa, 2015, it is hereby ordered

1. That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any lands in Allamakee County shall properly spray, cut, burn, or otherwise destroy all noxious weeds thereon, as defined in this chapter, at such time in each year and in such manner as shall prevent said weeds from blooming or coming to maturity, and shall keep their lands free from such growth of any weeds as shall render the streets or highways adjoining said land unsafe for public travel. Noxious weeds shall be cut or otherwise destroyed on or before the following dates as often thereafter as it is necessary to prevent seed production:

PRIMARY NOXIOUS WEEDS: JULY 15, 2017 for buckthorn, bull thistle, Canada thistle, field bindweed, hoary cress (Perennial pepper-grass) horsenettle, leafy spurge, musk thistle, perennial sowthistle, quackgrass, Russian knapweed, and tall thistle.

SECONDARY NOXIOUS WEEDS: JULY 15, 2017 for buckthorn plantain, cocklebur, wild sunflower, curly dock, poison hemlock, puncturevine, red sorrel (sheep sorrel), smooth dock teasel,

velvetleaf (butterprint), wild carrot, wild mustard, multiflora rose, shattercane, and purple loosestrife.

2. That each owner or each person in the possession or control of land in Allamakee County infested with any noxious weeds shall be expected to destroy and will immediately keep such infestations of said noxious weeds destroyed to prevent the weeds from blooming and maturing additional seeds.

3. That if the owners or persons in possession or control of any land in Allamakee County fail to comply with the foregoing orders, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this to be done and the expense of said work, including cost of serving notice and other cost, if any, shall be assessed against the land and its owners thereof.

4. The multiflora rose shall not be considered a noxious weed when cultivated for or used as undersod for cultivated gardens or as ornamental shrubs in gardens, per Iowa Code Section 317.1 (2).

5. That the Allamakee County Auditor is hereby directed to cause notice of the making and entering of foregoing order by on publication in each of the official newspapers of the County.

### SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF POSTVILLE, IOWA June 29, 2017

1. A special meeting of the City Council of Postville, Iowa, was held in the Council Chambers at 147 N. Lawler St. on June 29, 2017, beginning at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor Rekow presiding.

2. On call of the roll, the following Council Members were present: Mary Engstrom, Mary Straate, Ross Malcom and Larry Moore. Absent: Donald Miller.

3. Council Member Malcom approved the agenda as posted by the Clerk. Seconded by Straate. Carried.

• \$240,000 Taxable General Obligation Refunding Capital Loan Notes, Series 2017B

4. Council Member Moore made a motion to approve Resolution #1241-17, A Resolution Appointing Paying Agent, Note Registrar, and Transfer Agent, Approving the Paying Agent and Note Registrar and Transfer Agent Agreement and Authorizing the Execution of the Agreement. Seconded by Malcom. The roll was called ayes: Engstrom, Straate, Malcom and Moore. Nays: None. Carried 4:0.

5. Council Member Malcom made a motion to approve Resolution #1242-17, A Resolution approving and authorizing a form of Loan Agreement and authorizing and providing for the issuance, and levying a tax to pay the Notes; Approval of Continuing Disclosure Certificate. Seconded by Moore. The roll was called ayes: Engstrom, Straate, Malcom and Moore. Nays: None. Carried 4:0.

6. Council Member Malcom made a

motion to approve Resolution #1243-17, A Resolution Appointing Paying Agent, Note Registrar, and Transfer Agent, Approving the Execution of the Agreement. Seconded by Engstrom. The roll was called ayes: Engstrom, Straate, Malcom and Moore. Nays: None. Carried 4:0.

7. Council Member Malcom made a motion to approve Resolution #1244-17, A Resolution amending the resolution approving the authorization a form of loan agreement and authorizing and providing for the issuance, and levying a tax to pay the Notes; Approving of the Tax Exemption Certificate and Continuing Disclosure Certificate. Seconded by Moore. The roll was called ayes: Engstrom, Straate, Malcom and Moore. Nays: None. Carried 4:0.

8. Council Member Straate made a motion to approve the consent agenda:

a) Payment Agreement Request 136 S. Lawler St.

b) Renewal Application Liquor License Club 51.

c) Claims and Transfers for June 29, 2017.

Seconded by Engstrom. Carried.

9. Council Member Moore made a motion to approve the resolution for money to pay the claims. Seconded by Engstrom. The roll was called ayes: Engstrom, Straate, Malcom and Moore. Nays:

None. Carried 4:0.

10. Discussion was held with Waste Water Operator, Chris Hackman regarding the Collection System Phase 2 & 3. The scope of the project would involve eleven miles of sewer that would need to be televised with lining of the most critical areas identified. The City has obtained a CDBG \$500,000 grant with a deadline of

2019. Council Member Malcom made a motion to direction to staff to proceed with the project and begin borrowing the funding needed for the project. Seconded by Moore. Carried.

11. Discussion was held on water and sewer rates. Council Member Moore made a motion for the city attorney to draft the ordinance to increase water rates 2%. Council Member Moore rescinded the motion. Council Member Moore made a motion for the City Attorney to draft the ordinance increasing water rates 8%. Seconded by Engstrom. Carried.
