COUNTY ORDINANCE ADOPTION

On January 3, 2022, the Allamakee County Supervisors adopted the following Ordinance LXI to Establish Voting Precincts in Allamakee County following the 2020 population census.

ORDINANCE NO. LXI AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING VOTING PRECINCTS IN ALLAMAKEE COUNTY, IOWA

PURSUANT TO THE 2020 POPULATION CENSUS AND THE CODE OF IOWA CHAPTER 49

BE IT ENACTED BY THE Allamakee County Board of Supervisors: Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish election precinct boundaries pursuant to provisions of Chapter 49 of the Code of Iowa.

Section 2. Definitions. For use in this ordinance, the following terms or words shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

1. "Election Precinct" or "Precinct" shall mean a county or municipal subdivision for casting and counting votes in elections.

2. "Township" shall mean a civil and political subdivision of the county.

Section 3. Boundaries of Election Precincts. Allamakee County shall have ten (10) voting precincts, in addition to an absentee election precinct as required by law, whose boundaries shall be as follows:

Precinct 1. Hanover Township and Waterloo Township

Precinct 2. French Creek Township, Jefferson Township, Ludlow Township, Makee Township and Union Prairie Township

Precinct 3. City of Postville and Franklin Township and Post Township

Precinct 4. City of Waterville and Linton Township and Paint Creek Township

Precinct 5. City of Harpers Ferry

and Fairview Township and Taylor Township

Precinct 6. City of Lansing and Center Township, Lafayette Township and Lansing Township

Precinct 7. City of New Albin and Iowa Township and Union City Township

Precinct 8. City of Waukon First Ward

Precinct 9. City of Waukon Second Ward

Precinct 10. City of Waukon Third Ward

Section 4. Additional Publication Notice. Iowa Code Chapter 49.11 requires that the revised boundaries of precincts be published three (3) times, at least thirty (30) days before the next General Election.

Section 5. Repealer. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, including Allamakee County Ordinance LXI in its entirety, are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Severability Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 7. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in effect on January 15, 2022 after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

MINUTES OF THE ALLAMAKEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONDAY, JANUARY 3, 2022

Board members present: Byrnes, Schellhammer, and Reiser. All members voting "AYE" unless noted.

Meeting called to order by Auditor Beyer, followed by Pledge of Allegiance. Beyer asked for a motion to appoint 2022 Chairperson and Chairperson Pro-Tem.

22.001-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to appoint Larry Schellhammer as Chairperson of Board of Supervisors for 2022. Motion carried.

22.002-Motion Schellhammer/Second Reiser to appoint Dan Byrnes as Chairperson Pro Tem for 2022. Motion carried.

Chairperson Schellhammer took over as Chair for the remainder of the meeting.

22.003-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to approve today's agenda and minutes from December 27, 2021 meeting. Motion carried.

Public Comment: Doug Mullen asked if Supervisors are aware that legislature passed a law that cities and counties cannot regulate short-term rentals and short-term rentals need to be treated the same as long-term rentals. Mullen also commented about the blizzard topic that was discussed recently. Jack Knight stated that Allamakee County has a good reputation for good governance and it is appreciated. Val Reinke shared information regarding new rural dwellings, what cities in Allamakee are using their ARP funds for and ways to get involved in the Postville Community.

22.011-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to approve paying Precinct Election Officials \$15 per training for election trainings; pay regular PEOs \$175 per day for all elections and precinct Chairpersons \$215 per day for all elections; Absentee Board members \$10/hour and Absentee Chairperson \$11/hour with minimum pay of 2 hours for all Absentee Board; plus mileage. Motion carried.

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Ridenour presented bids taken through DOT for Prairie Drive project. Only one bid received from Mathy Construction for \$887,853.38. Engineer's estimate is \$959,668.55. Ridenour recommends approving Mathy bid.

Department Head updates: Attorney Anthony Gerrick spoke briefly about the 100+ Employer Vaccine Mandate and stated he would be looking into the method of what constitutes a full-time employee to reach the 100+ threshold for vaccine mandate. Gerrick asked to table the related 11:15 item until January 10. Auditor Beyer gave department update. Supervisor Schellhammer notified other Sups of a Fire Station meeting Tuesday evening this week. Corey Snitker gave updated CDC guidelines for isolation and quarantine and gave update that the county does not meet threshold for filing for assistance for the December wind storm. Engineer Ridenour reminded Supervisors about the upcoming 6-county meeting.

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
