MINUTES OF THE ALLAMAKEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 2021 (UNOFFICIAL)

Board members present: Byrnes, Schellhammer, and Reiser. All members voting "AYE" unless noted.

Meeting called to order by Schellhammer, followed by Pledge of Allegiance.

21.054-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to approve today's agenda and minutes from January 25, 2021. Motion carried.

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person or via Zoom: Joseph Moses – Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer – Auditor and Clerk to Supervisors, Jill Kistler, Marty Brennan, Val Reinke, Brian Ridenour, Darin Svenson, Laurie Moody.

Public Comment: Val Reinke reported they had 55 at Full Moon Snow Shoe Hike and about 75 kids at the Harpers Ferry Ice Fisherie this past week, and the Restaurant and Bar Relief Program opens at noon today.

Jill Kistler made a funding request for Humane Society of Northeast Iowa for FY22 and reported on the past year activities and rescue numbers.

Auditor Beyer reported the Mediacom contract signed a couple weeks ago did not include everything. Corrected 3-year contract is \$788.85/month.

21.055-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to approve the corrected 3-year Mediacom contract for \$788.85/month. Motion carried.

21.056-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to set March 1 at 9:40 am as the Public Hearing for Resolution approving FY22 Maximum Property Tax Dollars. Motion carried.

Engineer Ridenour presented bids for painted pavement markings. Fahrner Asphalt Sealers of Eau Claire, Wisconsin is low bidder and Ridenour recommends this bid, which is under estimate.

21.057-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to approve pavement marking bid total of \$81,134.53 by Fahrner Asphalt Sealers from Eau

Claire, Wisconsin. Motion carried.

Ridenour shared bridge replacement bids for Cota Creek Bridge in Harpers Ferry on B25. The bridge is 110' x 30'6". Low bid is about 9.42% over estimate. Ridenour explained that the state is pairing bridge projects together for funding – this one is paired with a bridge in Bremer County. The total of \$1,426,997.50 is for two bridges – one in Bremer County and one in Allamakee County. Ridenour would like Supervisors to take no action today until he is certain Bremer County is going to approve their bid.

Ridenour presented Yellow River Bridge replacement bids on Livingood Springs Road. Brennan was low bidder at \$799,366.85. Bids were 16.7% over estimate. Ridenour feels his estimate was low on structural concrete and if it had been at \$600/cubic yard the low total bid still would have been over estimate by 9+%. Ridenour explained options to Supervisors for both bridge projects, and recommends waiting a week before taking action to allow for public comment.

Ridenour explained he has not been able to acquire all signatures to obtain necessary right-of-way for the Iowa River Drive (A26) project, which means either condemnation or changing the project.

Department/COVID-19 updates: Engineer Ridenour is working toward hiring a maintenance person to fill a vacancy. Ridenour asked Supervisors to think about whether to make the COVID-19 vaccine mandatory or just strongly encourage it. Auditor Beyer reported her office is working on preparing the updated Employee Handbook with changes and is preparing publication for newspaper regarding the maximum levy for FY22 budget.

Board moved into budget work session to discuss FY22 budgets, funding requests and levies.
