Board members present: Byrnes, Keatley, and Reiser. All members voting "AYE" unless noted.
Meeting called to order by Byrnes.
Others present: Denise Beyer - Auditor and Clerk to Supervisors, Val Reinke, Rachelle Howe, Corey Snitker, Brian Ridenour.
Rachelle Howe of Upper Explorerland RPC informed Supervisors of another round of grants for fiber, requested a letter of support and \$500 as proof of commitment.
23.086-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to approve a letter of support and \$500 commitment for Upper Explorerland's grant application regarding fiber. Motion carried.
Engineer Ridenour and Supervisors discussed rock bids and looked at map with possible number of divisions and locations for rock bidding, agreeing on 7 divi-

sions.
Board and Auditor Beyer met until approximately 11:00a.m. to discuss changes in valuations and carryovers following the required recalculation of valuations due to legislation adjusting an assessment limitation (residential rollback). The net effect on County budget is about \$145,000 less tax dollars based on proposed tax levies. It was determined to not change any proposed levies and publish the Max Levy Hearing Notice with adjusted tax dollars related to new valuations.

Meeting called to order by Byrnes followed by Pledge of Allegiance.
23.078-Motion Keatley/Second Reiser to approve today's agenda and minutes from February 20 and 22, 2023 meeting. Motion carried.
The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person or via Zoom: Joseph Moses – Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer – Auditor & Clerk to Supervisors, Val Reinke, Carolyn Clark, Stephanie Runkle, Jean Bossom, Chris Fee, Amy Bresnahan, Clark Mellick, Jane Regan, Darin Svenson, Dave Mooney, Corey Snitker, Brian Ridenour, Jim Magner.

Public Comment: Carolyn Clark with Historical Society informed Supervisors that work has started on the Genealogy section of the Vet's Club Museum. Val Reinke reviewed weekend events including Ukrainian cultural event in Lansing. Reinke also gave childcare update regarding the \$5,000 program to incentivize in-home childcare centers who are willing to be registered and licensed with the State of Iowa. Stephanie Runkle gave update on extraction pit public meeting on Thursday, March 2, at 6:00 p.m.
Assistant County Attorney Jill Kistler notified Supervisors of additional Opioid Litigation settlements. Kistler asked they table this item until next week when she has finalized documents.
23.079-Motion Keatley/Second Reiser to table consideration of documents regarding additional opioid litigation settlements with 5 new entities. Motion carried.
23.080-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to approve the resolution of acceptance of final subdivision plat for Jacqueline L. Westby. Roll call: Reiser-aye; Byrnes-aye; and Keatley-aye. Motion carried. (Full text of resolution available in Auditor's office)
23.081-Motion Keatley/Second Reiser to approve the resolution of acceptance of final subdivision plat for Micah L. & Kaitlyn Abrams. Roll call: Reiser-aye; Byrnes-aye; and Keatley-aye. Motion carried. (Full text of resolution available in Auditor's office)
Beyer discussed option to change

to Max Levy hearing date due to legislation requiring recalculating of valuations that impact levies and tax dollars. Changing the hearing date is allowed as long as the entire budget approval process can be completed by the new April 30 deadline.
23.083-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to change Max Levy Hearing from March 6 to March 27, 2023 at 9:40 a.m. Motion carried.
Jane Regan reviewed County insurance and premiums and gave explanation of coverages. Overall, total premiums are up \$14,629.
Engineer Ridenour presented a resolution to add a secondary road project to the 5-year construction program. He explained there will be asphalt plants set up in two places in the county for other summer projects and feels taking advantage of one of these asphalt plants would save some expense. The project to consider adding is on Yellow River Drive from Old Stage to Forest Mills - last major rehab was done in 2002; a 4-mile stretch with an estimate of \$1.48 million with most expense paid out of FY23 budget and remainder in FY24. Ridenour requested approval of resolution by BOS, with next step being DOT approval and then letting for the project.

Corey Snitker gave Hazard Mitigation update and other department updates. Engineer Ridenour gave department update including working on a rocking map and determining divisions for bidding. Auditor Beyer gave department updates on recalculating valuations, budget and March 7 special election.
