Meeting called to order by Byrnes followed by Pledge of Allegiance.
23.088-Motion Keatley/Second Reiser to approve today's agen-

da and minutes from February 27, 2023 meeting. Motion carried. The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person or via Zoom: Joseph Moses – Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer – Auditor & Clerk to Supervisors, Marcia Rush, Amy Bresnahan, Tony Gericke, Stepha-

nie Runkle, Jane Regan, Jill Kistler, Brian Ridenour. Public Comment: Marcia Rush shared some photos of cemeteries in the county.

Auditor Beyer requested setting date/time for Canvass of March 7, Postville Special election to autho-

rize Hotel/Motel tax. 23.089-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to set March 13, 2023 at 9:40 a.m. for Canvass of March 7 Postville Special election. Motion

carried.
23.090-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to accept and place on file Manure Management Plan updates for Gibbs Dairy, EY #1 – Eric Weymiller, West Ridge Ag, LLC and B. Schultz. Motion carried.

The newly placed Goodwill Box in the south parking lot was discussed. Caleb Ferring's high school class built the box and created the sign. This is for emergency use for people in need of food and supplies. The box will be stocked with dry food goods and paper/personal supplies. A sign will be placed explaining options to donate to the box or places to receive additional relief services.

Marcia Rush will be advertising for openings on the Allamakee County Pioneer Cemetery Commission and holding an open house. Alla-

makee County Historical Society has agreed to let the Pioneer Cemetery Commission use their printer. Auditor Beyer will also advertise for Pioneer Cemetery Commission openings along with other board

openings.

Tony Gericke, on behalf of John Roe, requested that an ad be run for bids for replacing north and south sidewalks around courthouse. Mark Reiser will work with John Roe on the specs and preparing an ad.

Jill Kistler explained the Opioid Litigation settlements already done and new proposed settlements with Allergen, CVS, Teva, Walgreens and Walmart. Iowa's share of the settlement will go half to the state and half to local governments – local half is a little less than \$68 million. No breakdown between counties and cities yet. Approving the resolution today will allow Kistler and/or Gericke to sign/Docusign any necessary documents. Kistler recommends and requests approval of resolution presented today.
