day night music series at the park. Auditor Beyer reported that census numbers are to be released by April 30, tentatively, and by May 15, the Supervisors need to appoint a Redistricting/Reprecincting Committee to help determine new boundaries of precincts based on new census numbers.

Discussion was held regarding moving forward with finding an investor for solar panel installation at Safety Center and for Sheriff Mellick to be the contact person for the project. The County does not have any costs to install solar panel infrastructure. The County purchases the power generated by the solar panels, but an investor would have all expenses of installing the solar panel infrastructure. Supervisor Byrnes commented on the estimated annual savings of \$11,000 in electrical expense at Safety Center. John Nielsen, Perry Novak Electric, said there are investors who could sign right now and have a contract ready in 2 weeks to a month, but if the Supervisors want to find someone more local, the contract could take a little longer. The county at-torney will be asked to approve the contract language when it is received, before it is approved by BOS. Nielsen is not aware of a fee to connect to the grid. If there is a fee for this, it would be a cost to the county. Val Reinke encouraged Supervisors to give an opportunity to hear a perspective from Energy District members. Supervisors invite the Allamakee Energy District to come and give their feedback if they wish.

21.101-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to allow Sheriff and Chair of Board Of Supervisors to move forward on a PPA agreement and come back with a contract for final approval by Supervisors. Motion carried.

Auditor Beyer explained Nationwide's new Indexed Principal Protection option and asked the Supervisors to approve the addition of this option for employees investing with them. Employees would work with Nationwide on setting up this option.

21.102-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to approve adding the Indexed Principal Protection option for Nationwide. Motion carried.

There would be another \$75,000 for all the extras. Ridenour recommends Truck Country. Quotes include warranty. Approximate delivery Nov/Dec 2021.

Department/COVID-19 updates: Engineer Ridenour received a letter from Bruening about at-quarry prices stating a nickel increase, and Ridenour gave a project update and asked Supervisors to think about whether they'd like to do anything specific with COVID Relief dollars the county may be receiving, which is estimated about \$300,000 into county budget and \$100,000 into farm-to-market. Sheriff Mellick gave department update and St Patrick's parade day was fairly uneventful. Mellick may be requesting county credit card use for a recurring expense for Sheriff's office. Corey Snitker updated on today's winter storm, next week's Severe Weather Awareness Week, FEMA announced 100% payment for COVID related expenses, American Rescue Plan funding for counties, Long-Term Care facility indoor visitation requirement changes, COV-ID vaccine updates.
