Schellhammer, and Reiser. All members voting "AYE" unless noted. Meeting called to order by Schell-

hammer, followed by Pledge of Allegiance.

21.127-Motion Byrnes/Second to approve today's agenda and minutes from March 22, 2021. Motion carried.

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person or via Zoom: Joseph Moses – Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer – Auditor and Clerk to Supervisors, Bruce and Betty Mueller, Jim Garrett, John Bauercamper, Nikki Meyer, Val Reinke, Corey Snitker, Darin Svenson, Jon Luchsinger, Stephanie Runkle, Mandy O'Neill, Bruce Palmborg, Heather Homewood, Laurie Moody, John Roe.

Public Comment: Val Reinke said the Waterville Craft Fair was successful, the Kee High play had a good turnout and this upcoming week there are several community Easter Egg Hunts. John Bauercamper and Jim Garrett reported on progress of the Veterans Museum project, they are applying for grants and are grateful for the county support. John Bauercamper complimented John Roe on his help with the preparation for the jury trial last week. Corev Snitker asked Supervisors to consider adding an item to the long-term ICIT report about updating the cameras in the courthouse. Snitker reminded Supervisors of the tentative April 5 date to open up COVID vaccinations to everyone.

21.128-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to appoint James Garrett to Planning & Zoning Commission with term ending in 2022. Motion carried.

Heather Homewood needs a signature for an additional accreditation with National VFW, for cross-accreditation purposes. This gives her more options when help-

ing veterans with paperwork. 21.129-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to approve signing accreditation form for Heather Homewood. Motion carried.

Betty and Bruce Mueller explained the Vollara ActivePure technology air purifier and how it works as an option for county offices during COVID.

Supervisor Reiser asked questions about the Conservation department budget and uses of county tax dollars. Reiser also asked about the money that is donated at the Driftless Center that goes into the Conservation Foundation account, rather than the county general fund for expenses. He feels that money should be revenue for the county.

Auditor Beyer read the Advisory from Auditor of State stating that the Iowa Constitution prohibits donations to private non-profits. There are acceptable routes, such as entering a 28E agreement between the county and the private non-profit, with obligations upon and benefits to both parties, rather than donations/contributions. The county may need to enter into some 28E agreements with some of the organizations to which they make contributions.

Auditor Beyer followed up the start of a conversation from previous week regarding possible time-tracking options for county employees. So far she has names of 2 companies which offer options for time tracking and she will continue to look into options.

Auditor Beyer spoke about the portion of the American Rescue Plan act regarding the option for the county to offer additional paid time off for COVID reasons and the Expanded Family Medical Leave Act. No Supervisor interest in pursuing this further.

Auditor Beyer talked about Redistricting Reprecincting Commission which needs to be appointed by May 15. The Supervisors discussed the option of themselves working with Jon Luchsinger, acting as the Redistricting/Reprecincting Commission.

Department/COVID-19 updates: Engineer Ridenour informed Supervisors he will be hiring temporary seasonal help for the summer. Road crew will change to 4-day work week next week. Auditor Beyer will be working on certifying budgets city, township and school budgets.
