48.05 Glass Containers

 Identification and regulation of vendor sites · Imposition and collection of reasonable non-discriminatory user fees to offset planning, coordination, administration, regulation and enforcement activities, costs and expenses. However, it is recognized that there may be additional time, costs and expenses associated with peddlers and outdoor entertainment providers, and a higher fee, in the discretion of the commit-

tee, for non-local participants shall not be considered discriminatory. Denying access or use of the sites, as may be necessary for the protec-

tion of the public health, safety and welfare. **48.04 Electricity Connection Fee.** RAGBRAI Vendors requesting an electrical connection must request same as part of their Vendor Permit Application and submit an additional \$50 electrical connection fee with their Application. The City will make reasonable efforts to provide as many electrical connections as possible to RAGBRAI Vendors. However, the City cannot guarantee all electrical connections can be satisfied and will be provided

on a first come first serve basis. 48.05 Glass Containers. To promote safety during RAGBRAI on July 30, 2022, no RAGBRAI Vendor, existing business, restaurant, service station, grocery store or other establishment selling beverages for consumption by the public in an outdoor setting shall serve or sell any beverages in a

glass container. 48.06 Compliance with Applicable Laws and Regulations. All RAG-BRAI related activities shall comply with all City Ordinances not suspended by this ordinance and all applicable state laws and regulations including but not limited to the regulations of the Iowa Department of Health, Iowa Depart-

ment of Revenue, and the Iowa Alcoholic Beverage Division. 48.07 Street Closings and One-way Streets. During the effective date of this ordinance and without prior Council approval regarding the blocking of any city streets, the Police Chief, or his designee, may place barricades or roadblocks on any City street, alley or roadway to redirect vehicular traffic in order to enhance the proper and safe flow of bicycles and vehicular traffic within the City limits.

48.08 Nuisance. Violation of the provisions of this Chapter shall constitute a nuisance pursuant to Chapter 50 of the City Code of Ordinances and the City is authorized to take all nuisance abatement actions as provided for by Chapter 50. However, if the only nuisance or violation of this chapter is the offender's failure to obtain the necessary permit, the RAGBRAI Committee, in lieu of immediate abatement, may allow the person or organization to immediately purchase (cash only) a necessary permit as provided by this Ordinance.

48.09 Effective Period. The provisions of this ordinance shall be effective from the date of enactment and publication as required by law to August 1, 2022

48.99 Penalty. Nothing in this Chapter shall prohibit or otherwise limit the City's right to treat a violation of this Chapter as a municipal infraction pursuant to Chapter 3 of the City Code of Ordinances and subject to the

relevant civil penalties provided therein. SECTION III. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict

with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. SECTION IV. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION V. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be effective after its passage and publication as required by law and shall sunset on August
