LAWN MOWING NOTICE:

The Municipal Code chapter 151 states that the owner of any property shall cut and mow all lawns and lots so that such growth shall be less than four (4) inches at all times. If the property owner refuses or fails to cut and mow lawns and lots within forty-eight (48) hours after being delivered a notice from the City to perform such action, the Council may require said work to be done and the cost and expenses thereof shall be assessed to the property owner after due notice is given.

HABITUAL VIOLATORS. If the owner or person in control of any land has previously received a notice to abate nuisance relating to weeds or grass within the preced-

ing 24 months, then the notice to abate nuisance may include notice that such owner or person in control of said property will be considered to be an habitual violator of this chapter and that if the nuisance is not abated within the allowed time, the City will consider the property to be subject to having a contract let by the City for mowing property as needed up to a weekly basis for the next following 24-month period of time and that the full cost of said contract together with an administrative fee of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) will be assessed against the property. MINUTES OF THE ALLAMAKEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONDAY, APRIL 18, 2022 (UNOFFICIAL)

Board members present: Byrnes, Reiser and Schellhammer. All members voting "AYE" unless noted.

Meeting called to order by Schellhammer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

22.145-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to approve today's agenda and the minutes from April 11, 2022. Motion carried.

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person: Joseph Moses – Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer – Auditor and Clerk to Supervisors, Melissa Collum – Postville Herald, Ann Burckart, Val Reinke, Lyn Strong, John Roe, Corey Snitker, Jane Regan.

Public Comment: Ann Burckart asked about having ceilings done in two side offices. Val Reinke gave update on meetings and events.

22.146-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to accept and place on file quarterly reports for Planning & Zoning and Auditor's offices. Motion carried.

Val Reinke reviewed the details of the 2017 RAGBRAI Ordinance, and asked the Supervisors to set a public hearing date at next week's meeting.

Application for Board of Adjustments member was reviewed, for term ending December 31, 2025.

to Board of Adjustment. Motion carried.

22.148-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to award the bid for roof repair to Allen Roofing Construction at \$93,340. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on costs for courthouse repairs and improvements including ceilings, lighting and roof. Supervisors will finalize numbers for the obligation of ARPA funds for these purposes before next week.

Jane Regan presented cyber liability insurance quotes. BCS, our current carrier, Hiscox and IAMU CFC municipalities program were bidders. Regan recommends \$5,250 premium bid from IAMU with \$5,000 deductible with full prior acts coverage.
