Board members present: Byrnes, Keatley, and Reiser. All members voting "AYE" unless noted. Meeting called to order by Byrnes followed by Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment: Colleen Gragg commented on some things she noticed at the pioneer cemetery on Green Valley Road. Marcia Rush gave an update on Pioneer Cemetery activities. Val Reinke gave an update on events. Ann Burckart informed Supervisors of an incident on the missing concrete in west parking lot. Burckart also gave House File 718 update, which created a 65+ age homestead exemption of \$3,250 for 2023 assessment vear and \$6.500 for 2024 assessment year. This exemption will not be funded/backfilled by the state. HF 718 also increases the military credit from \$1,825 up to \$4,000; the state will reimburse military credit for one more year and then discon-

ers Construction, explained their courthouse facilities assessment process and next steps to get to knowing what the goals of the Supervisors are, and prioritizing what is most important and what the cost of those things are. This first phase is what the proposal covers. The construction phase would follow, and include bidding out what the Supervisors deem as priority. Big areas of concern - everything is aged, moisture concerns on lower level; systems that are past their useful life: asbestos concerns - a hazardous materials assessment would be needed; ADA compliance. Pinnow explained different types of asbestos and what type of project would require abatement. About a 4month process between when Sups say "go" to when they get a full bid and be able to move forward. Supervisor Byrnes explained they would have a work

session to make a plan to go forward on the proposals.

Applications for Pioneer Cemetery Commission were presented. 23.214-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to appoint Jacquelyn Everett to a term expiring 12/31/2024 and Doris Anderson to a term expiring 12/31/2026 as members of the Pioneer Cemetery Commission. Motion carried.

Corey Snitker reported on the Allamakee County Multi-Jurisdictional Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan update process. Next week a resolution will be presented to the Board of Supervisors.

Brian Ridenour recommended a new hire for Secondary Road department.

23.215-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to approve hiring Nicholas Cappussi as Maintenance Person 3, starting June 5, 2023 at \$21.84/ hour. Motion carried.

Ridenour informed Supervisors of a request from Secondary Roads union asking to reopen the union contract on wages only. Options from John Anderson, union negotiation counsel, were presented to BOS in email. Reiser feels the union agreed to the contract and feels it should be left as-is. Keatley feels there are situations that require a contract to be opened. No action taken.

Department Head updates: Corev Snitker informed Supervisors he will be taking over as Chairman of Northeast Iowa Response Group; gave update on Mississippi River flooding. Jean Bossom informed Supervisors she received follow-up questions for the grant she applied for regarding her hours worked, since she is not full-time and the grant requires a full-time position. She has decided to withdraw the application rather than have it be rejected. Engineer Ridenour gave update on openings in his department and project update including planned start date of June 12 for English Bench Site #9 project. Auditor Beyer gave department update including new employee starting tomorrow and reminder of next week's meeting on Tuesday due to the Memorial Day holiday.
