ORDINANCE NO. 708-23 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 106 (COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE) OF THE POSTVILLE, IOWA CODE OF ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POSTVILLE, IOWA: SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to amend certain provisions of Chapter 106 of the City Code to ensure that garbage and recycling collection services are available and consistent with the City's contract for such services.

SECTION 2. SECTIONS AMENDED. Chapter 106 is hereby amended as follows, with underlined text indicating language added and struck through language indicating removal: CHAPTER 106 COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE

106.05. BULKY WASTE. The owner of the premises served shall contact the collector to make a special arrangement for collection of any object too large or too heavy to be picked up on the normal collection route. The property owner shall be billed directly by the contractor for this service. The owner of the premises served shall contact the City to purchase a bulk item tag for collection of any object too large or too heavy to be picked up on the normal collection route. The cost of said bulk item tag shall be \$30.00. The property owner shall be responsible for contacting the collector to coordinate collection of the bulky waste.

106.08. COLLECTION FEES. The collection and disposal of solid waste as provided by this chapter are declared to be beneficial to the property served or eligible to be served and there shall be levied and collected fees therefor in accordance with the following: (Goreham vs. Des Moines, 1970, 179 NW 2nd, 449) 1. Fees. The fees for combined solid waste, recycling of solid waste and yard waste collection and disposal service, used or available, for each residential premises and for each dwelling unit of a two unit multiple-family dwelling shall be as follows:

Table with 3 columns: Date, Charge per dwelling unit per month - 96 Gallon Container \$30.00, Charge per dwelling unit per month - 64 Gallon Container \$25.00. Dates range from 7/1/2023 to 6/30/2024.

In addition to the above garbage collection fees, the Council may by resolution adopt a garbage collection fuel surcharge which shall be added to the monthly bill and collected in the same manner as the garbage collection fee.

2. Solid Waste Over Maximum. Refuse and garbage that cannot be fully contained in the garbage container may be disposed of in one of the following ways: A. Study garbage bags provided by the collector and clearly marked are available for purchase throughout the City. The cost includes the collection of the extra volume. These bags will be collected along with the regular garbage collection. Extra trash bag tags are available for purchase for \$4.00 each through the City. Any extra tag bags will be collected along with the regular garbage collection. Any extra bags that are not tagged with a City issued tag will not be collected.

B. A second garbage or recycling container can be requested for a minimum of one month's use. Occupants must notify the City when they desire to terminate the second garbage container usage. Fees will be charged as described above. Each additional container will be charged at the applicable rate established above. There shall be no prorated fees for partial month's usage and the person requesting the extra container is responsible for notifying the City when they desire to terminate the extra container usage. C. Excess garbage set outside of the garbage container shall be charged \$4.00 per bag, billed with the regular monthly container fee.

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed. SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law. PASSED AND APPROVED this 12th day of June, 2023.

**ORDINANCE NO. 709-23 AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 35 "FIRE DEPARTMENT" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF POSTVILLE, IOWA SECTION I. PURPOSE.** The purpose of this ordinance is to secure fire protection and rescue services for the City of Postville through the Postville Area Fire Protection District, a Chapter 28E separate legal entity created by the joint agreement of the City of Postville, the Townships of Post, Franklin, Ludlow and Grand Meadow and supported by the members of the previously volunteer fire department.

**SECTION II. CHAPTER REPEALED AND REPLACED.** Chapter 35 "Fire Protection" of the City Code is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following provisions. No underline/strikethrough text is included in this section, as the entirety of the Chapter 35 as shown below constitutes

newly added language:  
**CHAPTER 35 FIRE PROTECTION**  
**35.01 Contract.** Pursuant to Chapter 28E of the *Code of Iowa*, the City of Postville entered into a contract agreement for fire protection and prevention within the City on April 13, 2023, with the Postville Area Fire Protection District, with an operative date of July 1, 2023. Pursuant to the terms of the 28E Agreement, the Mayor of Postville is an automatic member of the Postville Area Fire Protection Commission which governs the Postville Area Fire Protection District. The City Council shall additionally appoint two (2) additional members from within the city limits of the City, to the Commission with at least one being a current member of the City Council for the City of Postville.  
 A copy of the 28E Agreement is on file with the Office of the City Clerk and with the Iowa Secretary of State.

*(Code of Iowa, Sec. 28E. 12)*  
**SECTION III. REPEALER.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.  
**SECTION IV. SEVERABILITY.** If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or m1y section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.  
**SECTION V. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall be effective on July 1, 2023, after its passage and publication as required by law.
