Our water system violated a drinking water standard over the past year. Even though this was not emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct

this situation.
The Postville Water Department is required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the month of July 2023 testing was not ran on (1) sample for **Bacteria/E**. **Coli\_**and therefore we cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.
What Happened?

During the month of July 2023, the Postville Water Department collected the required (3) Bacteria/E. Coli samples and sent them promptly to Keystone Labs in Waterloo lowa to be tested. However, (1) of the 3 samples did not get tested within the hold period required for the Bacteria/E. Coli test and was not able to be used. The other (2) samples came back negative. Normally the lab would have notified the Postville Water Department immediately of the error so the sample could be recollected and tested. Unfortunately, we were not notified of this issue until August after the sampling period had ended. We have since completed the sampling for August 2023, in which all 3 samples came back negative. The Postville Water Department has not had a positive Bacteria/E. Coli sample in the last 20+ years.
