MINUTES OF THE ALLAMAKEE **COUNTY BOARD OF** SUPERVISORS MONDAY, AUGUST 23, 2021 (UNOFFICIAL)

Board members present: Byrnes, Reiser and Schellhammer All members voting "AYE" unless noted. Meeting called to order by Schellhammer, followed by the Pledge of

Allegiance. 21.310-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to approve today's agenda moving Corey Snitker item to end, and the minutes from August 16, 2021. Motion carried.

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person: Joseph Moses -Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer - Auditor and Clerk to Supervisors, Jon Luchsinger, Stephanie Runkle, Dale Byrnes, Dennis Peterson, Gene Averhoff, Helen A Barbier, Laura L Gillespie. Betty Larsen. Jacob Dougherty, Erin Hines, Paul Whalen, Dave Mooney, Jim Janett, Jarrod Olson, Dawn Huffey, Laurie Moody, Darin Svenson, Mike Hohenbrink, Jane Regan, Brian Ridenour Corey Snitker Ray Mullarkey Shane Gavin, Doug Mullen, Ray Wagner, Ken Reiser.

Public Comment: None Jacob Dougherty, who has served as paramedic for 5 years, requested either payment upon registration for a Death Investigator course, or reimbursement upon completion of the course. He will be taking this course to become a Medical Examiner Investigator (MEI). Dr. Schwartz, a current Death Investigator, could use additional qualified individuals to assist with these duties and recommends Jacob Dougherty, by letter, to take the training. Training is available via Zoom this year which saves on hotel and meal expenses.

21.311-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to approve reimbursement of Jacob Dougherty for Death Investigator class fee in amount of \$650 upon successful completion of the class. Motion carried.

Dave Mooney recommends hiring for part-time position at Solid Waste. His current part-time staff has resigned. 21.312-Motion Reiser/Second

Byrnes to hire Lonnie Tysland at \$15.53/hour starting August 24 for Solid Waste, Motion carried.

Erin Hines requested having a food stand at Village Creek boat landing. She is certified/registered with Iowa Dpt of Public Health and would like to provide a small menu of items at the boat landing during bass tournaments. The DNR has told her she needs to get approval from DNR, which she was not aware of and asks permission from Supervisors to continue her food stand for remainder of 2021 season

and come back in 2022 for another season with the proper approvals in place from DNR. Jim Janett read from State Code and stated that Conservation Board would have to have this on their agenda for approval and they would have to put it out to bid. Jane Regan reminded BOS and Janett to always operate within their agreement with the DNR

- which would have to be amended from the current language that there can be no for-profit vendor on state county property. This amendment would need to start with Conservation Board. Regan reviewed the insurance requirements for any approved vendor to meet the county's requirements. Erin Hines will get on Conservation Board agenda to start

the approval process. Gene Averhoff spoke about Allamakee County becoming a Second Amendment Sanctuary County.

Dennis Peterson from Winneshiek County states the county law enforcement should protect citizen's Constitutional rights. Schellhammer would like County Attorney to review the resolution. Byrnes stated a resolution states the Supervisor's support and is not an enforceable law. Federal law supersedes county laws. Byrnes shared information he found regarding why the state doesn't become a Second Amendment Sanctuary State sharing concerns that this could send a wrong message that "I can do anything with firearms because this is a sanctuary state", and advised that caution should be used to ensure the wording doesn't come into conflict with state law. Reiser feels it is positive because it guarantees the Sheriff will protect us from the federal government. Schellhammer would like the County Attorney to look it over and possibly get opinion of County Sheriff, before voting on this resolution. This resolution will be presented to the County Attorney and put on a future agenda for approval.

No action taken until County Attorney input is obtained.

21.313-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to accept and place on file Environmental Health quarterly report. Motion carried.

Stephanie Runkle presented plats for approval.

21.314-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to approve the resolution of acceptance of final subdivision plat for Cote' Family Farm LLC. Roll call: Reiser-aye; Byrnes-aye; Schellhammer-aye. Motion carried. (Full text of resolution available in Auditor's office)

Byrnes/Second 21.315-Motion Reiser to approve the resolution of acceptance of final subdivision plat for Dale E & Virginia Kurth. Roll call: Reiser-aye; Byrnes-aye; Schellhammer-ave. Motion carried.

Auditor Beyer presented the 28E between ACED and Allamakee County.

21.317-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to approve the 28E agreement between Allamakee County and Allamakee County Economic Development. Motion carried.

Engineer Ridenour presented a Speed Limit Resolution and reviewed the request made to lower speed limit in the area of power plant and Whalen Hill Road near Lansing. A map was shared, as well as facts and figures from a Sheriff's speed study, accident history and number of homes, driveways, boat docks and mailboxes in this 1.447 mile length of road for proposed speed limit change. Engineer shared other information about possibly widening the shoulder along mailboxes, pedestrian traffic and signs along the area, and No Passing Zone consideration. Engineer and Sheriff agree that the facts support reducing the speed limit. Byrnes and Reiser spoke against the resolution. Byrnes stated there hasn't been a speed problem but would like to see white edge lines added next year. Schellhammer asked for a motion to approve the resolution. No motion was made. Doug Mullen and Ray Mullarkey spoke against the resolution.

Corey Snitker said he will have a display in the courthouse hallway with brochures regarding the new Allamakee County Alert Iowa emergency notification system.

Head/COVID-19 Department updates: Auditor Beyer informed Supervisors that tax statements were in mailboxes last week and people are starting to pay and she will attend the ISAC conference this week. Engineer Ridenour updated on 6-county meeting on Sept 2; concrete pavement patching planned start date is this week. Corey Snitker gave weather update, reviewed upcoming county events, and COVID-19 meetings and updates on booster vaccines with recommendation that it be at least 6 months following completion of initial COVID-19 vaccine.
