Snitker requested that the trailer be transferred to his department and insurance will be changed to EMA. 23.320-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to approve transfer of Solid Waste trailer to Emergency Management Agency. Motion carried. Snitker explained smoke alarms have not been tested for a long time. He has obtained an estimate of around \$500 to have someone come in and check all smoke and fire alarms and exit doors to make sure they are working properly. This would be paid out of Department 51, Courthouse Services. Snitker will check with the vendors who service the alarms at other county buildings to see if they can do all county buildings at the same

time in future years.

Auditor Beyer explained the removal of a homestead credit which was brought to Assessor's attention by the taxpayer. Looking into it, it was removed around 2012. but

just noticed by taxpayer this year. Discussion was held on how many years to abate. Motion Reiser to go half way, 5 years. No second. Motion died for lack of second.

Engineer Ridenour presented final voucher payment. Total project cost of \$1,415,481.86 is about 2.3% under contract amount.

Department Head updates: EMA Director Corey Snitker discussed the status of the Hazard Mitigation Plan approval; new AEDs for Sheriff's office; Mississippi flooding was declared a disaster by the President - Lansing is only jurisdiction affected; SBA is providing some drought relief. Engineer Ridenour gave update on English Bench watershed - has submitted claim for reimbursement; working on annual report due September 15. Auditor Bever reviewed ISAC meetings last week; she will resend Zoom invite for Thursday fleet management meeting with EMC; next week's meeting is at Vets Club.
