MINUTES OF THE ALLAMAKEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 2025 (UNOFICIAL)

Board members present: Byrnes, Keatley and Clark. All members voting "AYE" unless noted. Meeting called to order by Byrnes, followed by Pledge of Allegiance. 25.320-Motion Keatley/Second Clark to approve today's agenda and minutes from August 25, 2025 meeting. Motion carried.

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person and/or by zoom: Joseph Moses — Waukon Standard, Denise Beyer — Auditor, Chris Fee, Jean Bossom, Jill Kistler, Clark Mellick, Brian Ridenour, Stephanie Runkle.

Public Comment: Tom Clark reported that he participated in a Lansing Bridge call last week regarding the work on the Marina enhancement (using bridge money) to adequately accommodate the car ferry; goal to have the Cassville Ferry here by October 15; also talks with the company who built the Cassville car ferry to build another one for lowa; one big hurdle on the sandpile island where the ferry will land is the need to clear about 20 cottonwood trees and the US Fish and Wildlife Service says it will take about 6 months to approve a permit to remove those trees so work is now on contacting the necessary legislators on both states to get the process expedited.

Byrnes notified public of Gav-N View Farms LLC electronically filed Manure Management Plan.

Jean Bossom requested permission to place a ONEBox with Narcan/Naloxone on the second floor of courthouse next to the AED. Bossom will keep track of the expiration date of Narcan and be responsible for replacing it.

Clark Mellick informed Supervisors of problems getting and retaining employees for the dispatcher/jailer position for several reasons: Mellick feels overall they are competing against the private sector and neighboring counties who pay \$2-3 more per hour starting out and people are willing to drive to those other counties; the technolo-

gy dispatchers have to know/learn, working with inmates in the jailer role, working overnights and week ends and high-stress emergency situations are things that make the dispatcher/jailer job harder to find and keep good employees when they can make more in other counties or at lower stress jobs. The Jail Administrator wage was specifically discussed due to the extra duties; the current contract is written in a way that the wage of other positions would eventually surpass the current Jail Administrator wage. Mellick would like to be able to meet with the union and discuss an amendment to the current Col-
