Board members present: Byrnes, Keatley and Clark. All members voting "AYE" unless noted.

Meeting called to order by Byrnes. 25.341- Motion Keatley/Second Byrnes to approve today's agenda and minutes from September 15 and 17, 2025 meeting. Motion carried.

Present at different times throughout the meeting: Joseph Moses -Waukon Standard, Denise Beyer -Clerk to Supervisors, Jim Magner, Mike Hohenbrink – Postville Herald, Stephanie Runkle, Gary Bottorff, John Roe, Brian Ridenour. Public Comment: None

25.342-Motion Clark/Second Keatley to approve County Attorney use of county credit card for booking hotel rooms for Iowa County Attorneys fall conference. Motion carried.

25.343-Motion Keatley/Second Clark to approve resolution of subdivision plat for Larry & Cindy Schellhammer. Roll call: Clarkave; Byrnes-ave; Keatley-ave. Motion carried. (Full text of resolution available in Auditor's office)

25.344-Motion Clark/Second Keatley to approve resolution of subdivision plat for Triple M Ridge Farms LLC. Roll call: Clark-aye; Byrnes-aye; Keatley-aye. Motion carried. (Full text of resolution available in Auditor's office)

Byrnes reviewed the letter received that is addressed to the Historical Preservation Commission from The Towers LLC and the request for comments related to any historical or archeological significance at the site in Rossville. Supervisors have no objections.

Quotes for flag pole were discussed: LaCrosse Sign Group and Nagle Signs Inc. Supervisor Clark talked to a consultant who recommended a 50' flag pole, otherwise the pole will be overshadowed by the building. LaCrosse Sign Group – 50' flag-

pole \$13,920 and installation \$12,690 - total \$26,610. Nagle Signs Inc - 50' flagpole installed is \$17,641.58.

Clark feels Nagle's quote will likely not cover every aspect and estimating \$20,000 is likely more accurate. Moving the pole 5 feet closer to the building than previous pole was discussed. Nagle quote includes both the Iowa flag (6'x10') and US flag (8'x12') with the pole LaCrosse Sign Group lists flags as additional expense.

Discussion was held regarding replacing the pole, looking at budget later in this fiscal year when budgeting for FY26-27.

Fngineer Brian Ridenour presented the agreement for winter maintenance - rom W Main stoplight to Quillin's is City's responsibility (about .6 miles) and 9th street from DOT entrance on southwest side of town south to Hwy 9 is DOT responsibility (about .9 miles). All same as previous years. 25.345-Motion Clark/Second Keat-

ley to approve the Winter Maintenance agreement with City of Waukon and Iowa DOT. Motion carried. Department Head updates: John Roe updated on installation of steam traps and control valves - steam traps were installed last week; control valves were ordered as 1/2" pipe and should be 3/4" pipe so they need to reorder; 2<sup>nd</sup> floor ceiling is being done today. Engineer Ridenour stated his department could assist in digging out existing flagpole base if that would help with expense; updated on flood damage repairs and road projects; submitted annual report to DOT; DOT plan to resurface Hwy 9 in 2027 starting at John Deere to county line; 6-county meeting October 9 in Elkader. Auditor Beyer reported on filing deadline and ordering ballots for the November 4 city-school election. Corey Snitker gave update on active-shooter training exercise on Wednesday at the Allamakee Schools.

Auditor Beyer and Supervisors looked at inventory items to dispose of or sell
