Motion carried. Clark Mellick and Roger Mohn presented the bids for the concrete pad for the fire suppression tank and building for fire suppression pump - Chad Kelly Concrete bid \$10,835 for both and Adam's Concrete bid separately at \$2,770 for the building pad and \$10,491.75 for tank pad for a total bid of \$13,261.75. Kelly Concrete is the low bidder. For electrical work Perrv Novak Electric bid \$39.949.23 bids had been taken at a prior date. For the building for the fire suppression pump – two bids from Pat Stone Construction for \$23,467.00 and Ashbacher Building Supplies for \$9 610 00. Fire pump is on order and expected on December 8 - the company will do the installa-

tion. As soon as the foundation is in

for the tank then Tank Depot can install the tank. The timeline/order of steps for the rest of the project was discussed. Heating for the building was discussed. Updated total estimated cost is \$248,829.47 with all bids up to this point.
