## ORDINANCE NO. 693-23 • CITY OF POSTVILLE

**ORDINANCE NO. 693-23** AN ORDINANCE AMENDING **CHAPTER 65 (STOP OR YIELD** REQUIRED) OF THE POSTVILLE.

IOWA CODE OF ORDINANCES BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POSTVILLE, IOWA: SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The pur-

pose of this ordinance is to amend certain provisions of Chapter 65 of the City Code to ensure public safetv and traffic control at certain intersections within the corporate limits of the City of Postville, Iowa.

SECTION 2. SECTIONS AMEND-

ED. Chapter 65 is hereby amended as follows, with underlined text indicating language added and struck through language indicating removal:

**CHAPTER 65** STOP OR YIELD REQUIRED 65.03 FOUR-WAY STOP INTER-SECTIONS. Every driver of a vehicle shall stop before entering the following designated four-way stop

intersections: 1. Intersection of Tilden Street and Lawler Street. 2. Intersection of Cheryl Street and

Hill Street with Oak Drive. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.345) SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitu-

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law. PASSED AND APPROVED this 9 day of October. 2023

### MINUTES OF THE **ALLAMAKEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2023** (UNOFFICIAL)

Board members present: Byrnes and Keatley. Reiser absent. All members voting "AYE" unless not-

Present for work session: Benita Gossman - Clerk of Court, Jon Luchsinger, Michelle Gress, Denise Bever - Auditor & Clerk to Supervisors, Matt Marting - ACREC, Laurie Moody, Chris Fee, Jesse Swenson – NE Iowa Telephone, Stephanie Runkle, Karen Mathis, Mandy O'Neill

WORK SESSION: A work session was held to discuss adding the Clerk of Court's office phone lines/numbers to county courthouse phone system. Auditor Beyer has spoken with Annette Kunde with Court Administration about this request. Jesse Swenson with NEIT said two cards need to be added to the courthouse system to accommodate this addition - one for phone lines at \$300 and one for extensions at \$500. NEIT will then have to program their current phones into the courthouse system. Annette Kunde has approved payment of these charges plus labor. The courts will continue to get their own billing. The county is on a phone system that is about 20 years old and could also go bad at some point. Jesse explained cloud/ VOIP service Matt Marting with ACREC/ACSkyways informed the Supervisors that they are looking to give the courthouse two paths in/out of courthouse to provide less chance of disruption in service if only one of those lines gets cut/ isn't working. ACSkyways will be coming in this week to run fiber to the phone room. The current courthouse Mediacom contract expires in January 2024. County does not have to renew, but if they do and decide they want to switch, they likely will have to pay 75% to get out of contract. Marting said the courthouse could be up and running with ACSkyways in January; they would have to come and look at what needs to be done to connect Courts to county server. Supervisor Byrnes discussed who to get quotes from. How/if upgrades for security cameras fit into the project was discussed. Byrnes requested quotes from NEIT and ACREC. No quote is requested from Mediacom at this time. It was confirmed that the Clerk of Court and courthouse would be able to transfer calls between offices, which is not current-

ly an option. Board members present for regular Board meeting: Byrnes, Reiser and Keatley.

Regular meeting called to order by Byrnes, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance

23.352-Motion Keatley/Second Reiser to approve today's agenda with addition of one item (discuss/ consider Clerk of Court of courthouse lines and phones) and the minutes from October 2, 2023. Motion carried.

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person: Joseph Moses - Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer - Auditor and Clerk to Supervisors, Debbie Kohler, Benita Gossman, Tony Gericke, Brian Ridenour, Amy Bresnahan, Mike Hohenbrink, Ebony Cooksey -Nextl ink

Public Comment: Debbie Kohler expressed concern about a neighbor, outside City of New Albin, whose dog barks non-stop and inguired about what can be done. Law enforcement has spent a lot of time dealing with this, but there is not consequence due to no noise ordinance outside the city. Kohler expressed her right to a peaceful home and asked the Supervisors to consider putting something in place for rural nuisance/noise. Byrnes asked Kohler to talk to Zoning and will talk to the Zoning staff.

Supervisors reviewed what was discussed at the prior work session - temporary repairs to get cards added to courthouse phone system at \$800 plus labor paid by Clerk of Court. Chairperson asked for a motion to authorize adding Court phones to the courthouse phone system and Courts to pay the expenses

23.353-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to approve adding Clerk of Court lines and phones to the courthouse phone system and the Clerk of Court to pay the expenses of \$800 plus cost of labor. Motion carried.

23.354-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to accept and place on file two Manure Management Plan updates for W&M Ag LLC. Motion carried.

23.355-Motion Keatley/Second Reiser to accept and place on file quarterly reports for Recorder and Planning & Zoning. Motion carried. Supervisors viewed the Treasurer's quarterly report.

23.356-Motion Reiser/Second Keatley to approve County Attorney use of county credit card for purchase of furnishings at 12-1 st Ave NW and office supplies up to total of \$700. Motion carried.

Engineer Ridenour reviewed the request for maintenance of Hickory Nut Drive due to a new residence being built there. This road is a public county road, maintained once or twice a year; not currently maintained in the wintertime. Estimate of 200 feet/600 ton of rock would be added; Ridenour suggests asking Duehr's to pay for 100 ton of rock to have some buy-in. This would set a precedent for future requests. Ridenour will work up an agreement for Duehr's to sign agreeing to their share of the costs and put this back on the agenda.

is secured - they are obligated to build out in these areas. Supervisors thanked Cooksey for her presentation. Byrnes explained the email re-

Ridenour feels Winneshiek and Allamakee are both large enough to have their own Full-Time County Engineer. Ridenour is not in a position to say he can help, but is willing to revisit the topic if Winneshiek cannot find someone who can. His current contract has him working specifically for Allamakee County.

Department Head updates: Engineer Ridenour notified Supervisors that Amish signage (6 signs) have been placed on county roads - focusing on higher traffic roads; none on Elon Drive but he can review it if Supervisors request it. Ridenour said fuel quotes have been requested, the 6-county meeting for Engineers and Supervisors is Wednesday in Chickasaw County and gave road project update. Auditor Beyer gave election preparation update and auditing firm finished up field work last Wednesday.
