**ORDINANCE NO. 705-22
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING
CHAPTER 78 (SKATEBOARDS
AND SKATES) OF THE
CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY
COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
POSTVILLE, IOWA:**
SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to amend certain provisions of Chapter 78 of the City Code to add language to include Scooters and Electric Scooters to Chapter 78 and to clarify the prohibited uses of Scooters and Electric Scooters within the city limits of Postville, Iowa.
To further effectuate the City's purpose above, certain sections of the City Code of Ordinances must be amended and/or added to provide for the efficient regulation of Scooters/Electric Scooters and similar equipment operation within the city limits of Postville, Iowa.
SECTION 2. SECTIONS AMENDED. Chapter 78 is hereby amended as follows, with underlined text indicating language added and struck through language indicating removal:
**CHAPTER 78
SKATEBOARDS AND SKATES**
78.01 SCOPE OF REGULATIONS. The provisions of this chapter apply whenever a skateboard, roller skates, in-line skates, scooters or electric scooters are ridden or used upon any street or sidewalk in the City.
78.02 TRAFFIC CODE. Every person riding a skateboard, roller skates, in-line skates, scooters or electric scooters upon a roadway shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle by the laws of the State or the Traffic Code contained in this Code of Ordinances, except as those provisions which by their nature can have no application.
78.03 SPEED. No person shall operate a skateboard, roller skates, in-line skates, scooters or electric scooters at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions then existing.
78.04 RESTRICTED AREAS. No skateboards, roller skates, in-line skates, scooters or electric scooters shall be ridden or used at any time on the following streets or sidewalks:
1. In the roadway of U.S. Highways 18 and 52;
2. In the roadway of Iowa Highway 51;
3. In the roadway of Lybrand Street;
4. In the roadway of Greene Street, and on the sidewalks along Greene Street, between Reynolds Street and Lawler Street;
5. In the roadway of Lawler Street and on the sidewalks along Lawler Street, between Post Street and Greene Street.
78.05 YIELD TO PEDESTRIANS. Whenever any person is riding a skateboard, roller skates, in-line skates, scooters or electric scooters upon a street or sidewalk, such person shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian.
78.06 SPECIAL PENALTY. Any person violating the provisions of this chapter may, in lieu of the standard penalty provided for violations of this Code of Ordinances, suffer his or her skateboard, roller skates, in-line skates, scooters or electric scooters to be impounded for five (5) days for the first offense, then (10) days for the second offense and thirty (30) days for the third offense.
SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

**ELECTRIC POWER LINES
AND GRAIN BINS DON'T MIX!**
Please contact your local electric cooperative/utility if you plan to build a grain bin in the vicinity of an electric distribution line or electric transmission line.
Dairyland Power Cooperative owns and operates transmission lines in Northeastern Iowa, which provide electrical energy to local rural electric cooperatives and municipalities. Those transmission lines are operated at voltages that greatly exceed local distribution and service lines that may be located on your property. Dairyland will provide assistance in planning the placement of the grain bin near our transmission line to provide a safe environment for everyone working and living around grain bins.
The State of Iowa requires specific clearances for electric lines around grain bins, with different standards for those filled by portable and permanent augers, conveyors and elevators. The drawings show specific clearances required for each scenario.

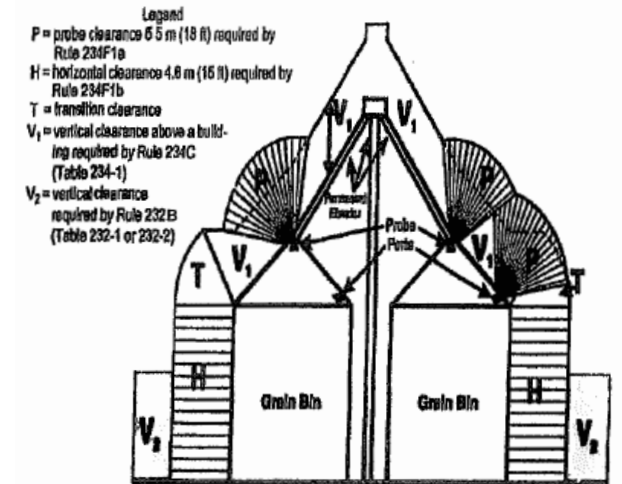


Figure 234-4(a)—Clearance envelope for grain bins filled by permanently installed augers, conveyors, or elevators

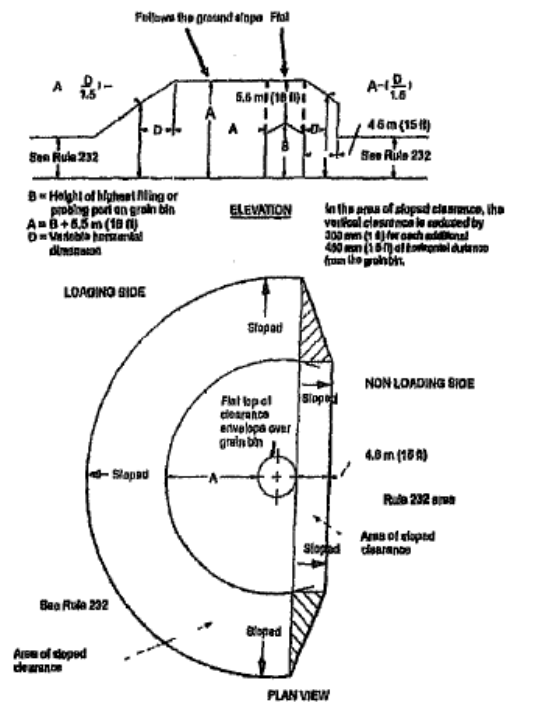


Figure 234-4(b)—Clearance envelope for grain bins filled by portable augers, conveyors, or elevators

According to the Iowa Electric Safety Code found in Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 199 - 25.2(3)b, your local electric utility may refuse to provide electric service to any grain bin built near an existing electric line which does not provide the clearances required by The American National Standards Institutes (ANSI) C2-2017 "National Electrical Safety Code," Rule 234F. This Paragraph "b" shall apply only to grain bins loaded by portable augers, conveyors or elevators built after September 9, 1992, or to grain bins loaded by permanently installed augers, conveyors or elevator systems installed after December 24, 1997. (As adopted by the Iowa Utilities Board)

Dairyland Power Cooperative is required by the Iowa Utilities Board to provide this annual notice to farmers, farm lenders, grain bin merchants, and city and county zoning officials.
