h. Each Agreement entered into pursuant to this Ordinance shall be promptly recorded by the property owner, at the property owner's expense, in the office of the Allamakee County Recorder as an easement for use of the land as a burial site.

#### SECTION 5. PENALTY FOR VI-OLATION

Failure to comply with any provision of this Ordinance shall be declared unlawful, and punished civilly or criminally.

a. Injunction and Abatement. The County, through its authorized agents, may initiate injunction or abatement proceedings or other

c. A violation of this Ordinance may also be punished criminally with the criminal penalty not to exceed the maximum fine and term of imprisonment for a simple misdemeanor under Iowa Code § 903.1(1)(a), and with each day of a continuing violating constituting a separate violation.

### SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adiudication shall not affect the validity of either the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional
