1. A special meeting of the City Council of Postville, Iowa, was held) in the Council Chamber's at 147 N. Lawler St. on October 19, 2022, beginning at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor Koenig presiding.

Mayor Koenig administered the oath of office to Devora Klein-Mahr. 2. On call of the roll, the following Council Members were present: Becky Engelhardt, Mary Eng-strom, Ross Malcom and Devora Klein-Mahr. Absent: Larry Moore. \*Moore arrived at 6:10 p.m.

3. Mayor Koenig removed item # 6 from the agenda. Council Member Engelhardt made a motion to approve the agenda as amended by the Mayor. Seconded by Engstrom. Carried 4:0. Absent: Moore. \*Moore arrived at 6:10 p.m.

4. Discussion was held on the city receiving notification that the COPS Grant funding was awarded to Postville \$125,000 total for three- year retention for a full- time police officer. The cost for a fulltime officer is \$82,000 per year includes wage and benefit the council will need to allocate \$42,000 match per year additional funds per the terms of the grant. The council will discuss at the November 14th

meeting the budget shortfall. 5. Council Member Malcom made a motion to set the Public Hearing for December 12, 2022 to amend the City Budget FY 22/23. Seconded by Engelhardt. Carried 5:0. 6. The Council reviewed recommending funding options from the financial advisor for land purchase. It was council recommendation for the clerk to proceed with option 1 funding. Council Member Malcom made a motion to adopt Resolution #1362-22. A resolution authorizing purchase of real property, land purchase agreement contingent on the City obtaining financing and not re-ceiving a petition for an election on the financing. Last week the façade program, contracts and scoring criteria were discussed. The grant program being discussed is for rural businesses and those in city limits. It was consensus that since the County has the final approval/ say the grant funds will stay with the county and be paid out to the business once the final approval is given for a grant award. Discussion was held on how long a business has to keep the business/building before selling it after receiving a grant. Kelleher volunteered to add in the scoring criteria that stronger consideration will be given if the plan is for long-term ownership of the building. Owners with multiple buildings could apply separately for each building. Reiser asked for language to include agreement to 3-year ownership following receipt of grant, with agreement by owner to repay the funds at 100% if business sold any time in first 3 years after receipt of grant funds. Language will be updated and presented to County Attorney for approval. 22.388-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to table consideration of façade program language, contracts and scoring criteria. Motion carried.
