Under the provision of the Zoning Ordinances the Zoning Administrator was required to deny the permit application for Tamling because they do not meet the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance. However, the Board of Adjustment, under certain conditions and safeguards, may have the authority to grant this request. The Board of Adjustment may grant conditional use requests, as authorized under the zoning ordinance.

Meeting called to order by Schellhammer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.
20.396-Motion Byrnes/Second Koenig to approve today's agenda and the minutes from November 2, 2020. Motion carried.

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person or via Zoom: Joseph Moses – Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer – Auditor and Clerk to Supervisors, Jon Luchsinger, Laurie Moody, Val Reinke, Corey Snitker, Tom Blake, Darin Svenson, Mandy O'Neill.
Public Comment: Val Reinke reported on bloggers asking to visit and blog about Allamakee County and upcoming events scheduled in the county.

Larry Schellhammer reviewed the possibility of combining duties of Environmental Health and Planning & Zoning with the retirement of Tom Blake, current P&Z Administrator, on November 30. Blake and Laurie Moody explained the changes in their current job duties since the two positions were split, back in 2009. It was determined to keep the two positions separate. Tom will email his job description to the BOS for review. One member of BOS will be involved in the interview process. Schellhammer firmly expressed concerns about comments from public regarding the frequency of

neither Moody nor Blake being available in their office and the need to improve this situation.

Blake explained the need to set a date/time for a public hearing for 2020 Comprehensive Plan update, before end of November.

Department/COVID-19 updates: Corey Snitker updated on meetings with hospital; PPE requests will now go through a "node system" and Allamakee pickup site will be in Bremer County; Pfizer is moving ahead on a COVID-19 vaccine – a 2-shot process. Mask update from Public Health/CDC – people who are masked who are in contact with others who test positive, the masked person that was exposed does not have to quarantine. Submission of COVID-19 FEMA disaster claim is due November 15. Auditor Beyer reported on election turnout and the post-election audit and consideration of late absenteees and provisional ballots. Tom Blake and Laurie Moody gave department updates and confirmed that the County is still not allowing overnight travel for meetings.

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF POSTVILLE, IOWA NOVEMBER 9, 2020
1. A regular meeting of the City Council of Postville, Iowa, in the Council Chambers at 147 N. Lawler St. on November 9, 2020, beginning at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Rekow presiding.
2. On call of the roll, the following Council Members were present: Mary Engstrom (via phone), Ross Malcom, Zev Frimerman (via phone) and Larry Moore. Absent: Don Miller.
3. Council Member Moore made a motion to approve the agenda as posted by the Clerk. Seconded by Malcom. Carried 4:0.
4. During citizen comments Chaim Cyrus informed the council he had missed last month meeting to dispute his nuisance abatement at 215 S Lawler and requested it be addressed at the next council meeting. The Council agreed to address his appeal at the December 14, 2020 meeting.
5. Maggie Burger, Speer Financial gave an update on the City's annual TIF report.
6. Rebecca Vasquez Powers requested the council consider an appeal to City Code Section 204.31 to allow occupancy of a travel trailer which is limited to not more than 72 hours unless special approve is granted by the City Council. Ms. Powers stated they recently located to Postville and the RV is their home, they were unaware of the special approval that was required by City Code. Council Member Moore made a motion to grant the approval request allowing the camper to reside in the Mobile Home Park. Seconded by Malcom. Carried 4:0.
7. Andy Moore with Farm Bureau Insurance gave an overview of the City Health Insurance renewal with Wellmark. The health plan will increase 2.75%; however the dental plan will decrease for the calendar year 2021. Council Member Malcom made a motion to approve the Health Insurance Renewal with Wellmark. Seconded by Moore. Carried 4:0.
8. Discussion was held on a policy of the fire department that establishes protocol for what responds to specific calls, and who is able to cancel the department. The policy drafted stated that only the Fire Department Officer on scene may cancel ambulance or fire. Police Chief Ellis disagreed with such a policy when law enforcement is usually first on scene. The Council directed the Chiefs to get together and revise the policy so all were in agreement.
Fire Chief Heiland informed the council of a gasket seal leaking on Unit 511 which needs to be repaired as it would not pass the pump testing. The estimated cost to repair from Emergency Apparatus Maintenance was \$2,100. The Council directed the Chief to get another bid and have the Mayor approve the low bid to get the pump repaired.
9. Council Member Malcom made a motion to approve the police computer purchase request from Monona Computer in the amount of \$1,043.97. Seconded by Moore. Carried 4:0.
10. Council Member Malcom made a motion to approve the proposal of Lynch Dallas for City Attorney Services. Seconded by Engstrom. Carried 4:0.
