### MINUTES OF THE ALLAMAKEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONDAY, DECEMBER 6, 2021 (UNOFFICIAL)

Board members present: Reiser and Schellhammer. Byrnes absent. All members voting "AYE" unless noted.

Meeting called to order by Schellhammer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

21.426-Motion Reiser/Second Schellhammer to approve today's agenda, and the minutes from November 29, 2021. Motion carried.

Public Comment: Val Reinke reported on events for the upcoming week and ongoing discussion regarding daycare needs in the county, apartments in Waukon, and meeting with Postville Developer.

Dave Mooney requested permission to have a Kwik Trip account/card as Bresnahan station is closing soon and that is where they currently have a card.

21.430-Motion Reiser/Second Schellhammer to accept and place on file Manure Management Plan update for Grove #5. Motion carried.

21.431-Motion Reiser/Second Schellhammer to set December 20, 2021 at 9:40 a.m. for Public Hearing regarding Ordinance describing precinct boundaries. Motion carried. Department Head updates: Corey Snitker gave department and weather updates; uptick in COVID cases around the whole country; working on grant application for Hazard Mitigation Plan update. Supervisor Reiser asked Stephanie Runkle about a campground question and Runkle updated Supervisors that she is working with the campground on the issue. Sheriff Mellick reported the progress on the solar panel field. Attorney Gericke reminded Supervisors of the County Christmas party on Friday, December 10. Sheriff Mellick gave a department update.

Supervisor Schellhammer updated on the Zoom meeting last week regarding the opioid litigation settlement. Attorney Gericke requests the Supervisors approve and sign the Resolution authorizing Allamakee County to enter into presented settlement agreements - one agreement for Distributors and one for Janssen.

21.433-Motion Reiser/Second Schellhammer to authorize Tony Gericke to sign the Agreements, MOU and any other necessary papers regarding Opioid Litigation. Motion carried.

Gericke reviewed what the uses of the settlement dollars can be used for such as treatment, education at schools, first responder training and equipment, etc. They plan to discuss uses with the hospital. Payments will start in January, with second payment in July and continuing payments once per year, with amounts of payments to be finalized based on how many counties choose to participate. Estimates for Allamakee are at \$18,000 per year.

Val Reinke introduced the Home Base Iowa program. Jathan Chicoine, program manager for Home Base Iowa, explained the program goal of connecting Veterans looking for jobs to businesses in communities looking to fill jobs. Reinke spoke about what businesses are on the Home Base Iowa website right now, and what ACED will do for Veterans and their spouses and families if they want to visit Allamakee County. Heather Homewood read a statement from Veterans Affairs about the positive points of the Home Base Iowa program.

### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. LXI

#### AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING VOTING PRECINCTS IN ALLAMAKEE COUNTY, IOWA

The Allamakee County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing for the first reading of Ordinance LXI – Establishing Voting Precincts Pursuant to the 2020 Population Census and the Code of Iowa Chapter 49. The public hearing will be held during the Board of Supervisors meeting in the Board of Supervisors room at 110 Allamakee St, Waukon, IA 52172 on Monday, December 20, 2021 at 9:40 A.M. A summary of Ordinance LXI follows:

**Section 1. Purpose.** The purpose of this ordinance is to establish election precinct boundaries pursuant to provisions of Chapter 49 of the Code of Iowa.

**Section 2. Definitions.** For use in this ordinance, the following terms or words shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

1. "Election Precinct" or "Precinct" shall mean a county or municipal subdivision for casting and counting votes in elections.

2. "Township" shall mean a civil and political subdivision of the county.

#### Section 3. Boundaries of Elec-

tion Precincts. Allamakee County shall have ten (10) voting precincts, in addition to an absentee election precinct as required by law, whose boundaries shall be as follows:

- Precinct 1. Hanover Township and Waterloo Township
- Precinct 2. French Creek Township, Jefferson Township, Ludlow Township, Makee Township and Union Prairie Township
- Precinct 3. City of Postville and Franklin Township and Post Township
- Precinct 4. City of Waterville and Linton Township and Paint Creek Township
- Precinct 5. City of Harpers Ferry and Fairview Township and Taylor Township
- Precinct 6. City of Lansing and Center Township, Lafayette Township and Lansing Township
- Precinct 7. City of New Albin and Iowa Township and Union City Township
- Precinct 8. City of Waukon First Ward
- Precinct 9. City of Waukon Second Ward
- Precinct 10. City of Waukon Third Ward
