



**PUBLIC NOTICE**

**MINUTES OF THE ALLAMAKEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONDAY, DECEMBER 13, 2021 (UNOFFICIAL)**

Board members present: Reiser and Schellhammer. Byrnes absent. All members voting "AYE" unless noted.

Meeting called to order by Schellhammer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

21.435-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to approve today's agenda, and the minutes from December 6, 2021. Motion carried.

The following people were present at various times throughout the meeting in person: Joseph Moses – Standard newspaper, Denise Beyer – Auditor, Rick Zarwell, Jenny O'Neill, Corey Snitker, Jon Luchsinger, Laurie Moody, Stephanie Runkle, Brian Ridenour.

Public Comment: Rick Zarwell commented on Bluffland Protection and reviewed how a committee was convened to create the ordinance in about 2006.

Treasurer Jenny O'Neill reviewed the Allamakee County Investment Policy and changes made regarding eligible banks, and explained if the Supervisors wish to include People's State Bank in the policy, a resolution needs to be signed.

21.436-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to approve resolution naming depositories to include People State Bank. Roll call: Reiser-aye; Byrnes-aye; Schellhammer-aye. Motion carried. (Full text of resolution available in Auditor's office)

21.437-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to approve the Allamakee County Investment Policy. Motion carried.

Auditor Beyer explained that there needs to be a public hearing for comments on the new precinct boundaries before the public hearing for the ordinance. She requests it be set for same time next week as Public Hearing for Ordinance.

21.438-Motion Reiser/Second Byrnes to set public hearing for comment on changes to precinct boundaries for December 20 at 9:40 a.m. Motion carried.

Auditor Beyer presented an agreement which is needed for cities over 2,000 where voters from unincorporated areas vote in same precinct as incorporated area voters.

21.439-Motion Reiser/Second

Byrnes to approve agreement with City of Postville to combine unincorporated voters and unincorporated voters. Motion carried.

Engineer Ridenour presented and explained an updated Bridge Embargo resolution. Some bridges have dropped off for weight restrictions, but none have been added.

21.440-Motion Byrnes/Second Reiser to approve the Bridge Embargo resolution as presented. Roll call: Reiser-aye; Byrnes-aye; Schellhammer-aye. Motion carried. (Full text of resolution available in Auditor's office)

Corey Snitker presented information regarding COVID-19 – the original timeline of January 4, 2022 when employers with 100+ employees must require vaccination of employees, or mandatory weekly COVID-19 testing for those not vaccinated; these requirements are on hold due to pending litigation. If or when the testing is required of non-vaccinated employees, Corey Snitker, Em Mgmt Director, does not have COVID-19 test kits available. The pharmacies or Public Health are options to purchase kits. The Supervisors and Engineer Ridenour discussed existing requirements for exposed, non-vaccinated employees to quarantine for 7 days, and can return to work on the 8th day if they take a test on 5th day with a negative result. Vaccinated employees with exposure have no requirement to quarantine, unless symptoms are present. Free Test lowa kits are available from hospital or a local pharmacy, or can be requested online.

Department Head updates: Engineer Ridenour gave department update including one resignation, and project update. Ridenour offered the Supervisors an opportunity to review the Snow Ordinance which was last done in 2000. Corey Snitker updated on the weekend weather and upcoming weather. Auditor Beyer informed the Supervisors that budgets have been sent out and the process of verifying valuations has begun.
