NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Board of Supervisors are considering repealing Ordinance XIX and Ordinance XXXIX and, in lieu thereof, adopting of a new Ordinance XXXIX, a Flood Plain Management Ordinance (ordinance) and will hold a public hearing on Monday, September 8th, 2020 at 9:40 A.M, in the Supervisors Office in the Allamakee Co. Courthouse, Waukon, IA at which time you may submit your views on these matters in person, in writing or by representative.

This ordinance is a special purpose zoning ordinance established under authority of Chapter 335 of the Iowa Code. It establishes zoning districts for the flood hazard areas within the County as identified by the Flood Insurance Study and regulates development within those zones. The ordinance meets the minimum requirements for acceptance into the National Flood Insurance Program for counties which have a detailed Flood Insurance Study issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The ordinance establishes a development permit system which requires a permit for all development within the floodplain zones.

As written, the ordinance defines the

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terms specific to flood plain development, states the statutory authority, findings of facts and purpose of the ordinance and establishes that the Flood Insurance Rate Map dated September 18, 2020 as the Official Floodplain Zoning Map (Map). The Zoning Administrator is appointed to implement and administer the provisions of the ordinance. The ordinance provides for the requirement of a Floodplain Development Permit for all development in the floodplain, as defined and delineated in the Map. The Ordinance establishes the Floodway, Floodway Fringe and General Floodplain Overlay Districts and establishes the performance standards for all development and land uses within said districts as shown on the Map. The ordinance establishes the Appointment and Duties of the Board of Adjustment, methods and process for appeals of any decisions by the Zoning Administrator or the

Board of Adjustment. Non-conforming structures and uses that are discontinued for 6 consecutive months, become a nuisance or are destroyed by any means shall not be reconstructed if the cost is more than fifty (50) percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred, unless it is brought into conformity with

this ordinance.

Violations of this ordinance or failure to comply with any of the requirements of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than \$750 or imprisoned for not more than 30 days and each day that said violation continues shall be considered a separate offense. Allamakee County reserves the right to take any lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation.

The regulations and standards set forth in this ordinance may be amended, supplemented, changed or repealed but no such amendment, supplement, changes or repeals shall be undertaken without prior approval of the Department of Natural Resources.

Motion carried. COVID-19 updates: Ridenour had an employee tested last week but results came back negative. Sheriff Mellick is having an inmate brought in from Texas by a transport company and when the inmate arrives, they can screen him, test him for COVID-19 and quarantine him for 2 weeks before placing him with general jail population. Cost for transport is over \$3,000. Corey Snitker reminded that school resumed today and he will stay in touch with the schools as they move forward. Department Head updates: Sheriff Mellick will work with Engineer Ridenour on speed issues at VCBC. Corey Snitker reviewed the CARES grant relief fund and gave weather update for the week. Auditor Beyer reported that tax statements are hitting mailboxes as of late last week and election trainings were held three afternoons last week. Once tax statements have been out for a week or so then the Auditor will do Real Estate year end process and get the 2020 valuation file from the Assessor's office.
