PUBLIC NOTICE OF GENERAL ELECTION TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2020

Public Notice is given that the General Election in the County of Allamakee, State of Iowa, will be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2020.

HOURS: Election polls for the 2020 General election will open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 9:00 p.m.

ABSENTEE VOTING: Due to the continued COVID-19 pandemic, all voters are encouraged to vote absentee by mail or in-person. We encourage voters to bring your own pen if voting in-person.

BY MAIL: The deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail was Saturday, October 24, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.

IN PERSON: In person absentee voting is available at the Allamakee County Courthouse now thru close of business on Monday, November 2, 2020. Regular office hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The office is required to be OPEN 2 SATURDAYS: October 24 from 8am-5pm and October 31 from 8am-5pm for in-person absentee voting.

ELECTION DAY, NOVEMBER 3:
Due to the COVID-19 virus, there will be 8 polling sites rather than the normal 11 to help prevent spread of the COVID-19 virus and expose fewer poll workers to the virus.

ID: All voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before they may receive and cast a regular ballot. Any voter unable to show approved ID may have their identity attested to by another registered voter in the same precinct who has proper ID and then vote a regular ballot, or may vote a Provisional ballot and provide ID to the County Auditor by November 9 at Noon to have their ballot counted. Voters who are not pre-registered or who have changed precincts may be required to also provide proof of residence. PRE-REGISTRATION DEADLINE is/ was October 24, 2020. If not pre-registered by this date, eligible persons have the right to register to vote and cast a ballot from October 26 through November 2 in-person at courthouse, or on Election Day, if they are able to provide proof of both their identity and residency. Please bring a valid and current photo ID with an expiration date. If the address on your ID is not current, you will need to prove residency with a document that contains your name and current address. If you do not have proof of identity and residence, a registered voter in your precinct may attest for you and both voter and attester will be required to sign an oath. Any questions regarding this should be directed to the Allamakee County Auditor's Office at (563) 568-3522.

ACCESSIBILITY: All polling places designated for use in this election are accessible to persons with disabilities. Any voter who is physically unable to enter a polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle. Look for the Curbside Voting signs with instructions at each polling location.

PUBLIC TEST: The general public is invited to a Public Test of the Unisyn Voting System to show how the votes will be counted for the General Election. The demonstration will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, October 29, 2020, on the 4th floor (former 911 dispatch center) of the Allamakee County Courthouse, 110 Allamakee St, Waukon, IA.

Meeting called to order by Schellhammer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

20.359-Motion Koenig/Second Byrnes to approve today's agenda and the minutes from October 5, 2020. Motion carried.

Public Comment: Val Reinke reviewed events from this past weekend including Sip of Lansing, Driftless Half Marathon, Waterville Craft and Vendor Show, Drive-In movie night at VWW Dairy and the Iowa Galavant travel writer visit. Dan Byrnes commented on the successful Driftless Half Marathon on Saturday, and the Lansing PD and the County Sheriff's department did a good job with it.

COVID-19 updates: Corey Snitker is still meeting weekly with long term care facilities; schools may be able to quarantine fewer students due to CDC view change that if both parties are wearing a mask and one is diagnosed with COVID, the other party does not need to quarantine; Driftless Marathon went well Saturday; working on grants; Winneshiek County Medical Center is going to have a Test Iowa site beginning today. Ridenour commented that if a COVID-19 vaccine becomes available, the county would have a choice to consider mandating the vaccine for employees. Auditor Beyer reminded that the drop boxes on the bench in lower level hallway will be removed after Friday, October 16 with the outdoor drop box now available.

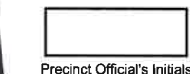

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence

attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the County Auditor's office by 12:00 noon on November 9, 2020. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. 1. A regular meeting of the City Council of Postville, Iowa, in the Council Chambers at 147 N. Lawler St. on October 12, 2020, beginning at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Rekow presiding.

2. On call of the roll, the following Council Members were present: Don Miller, Mary Engstrom, Ross Malcom, and Larry Moore. Absent: Zev Frimerman.

3. Mayor Rekow removed Postville Volunteer Fire Department audit bill from the agenda. Council Member Engstrom made a motion to approve the agenda as amended by the Mayor. Seconded by Miller. The roll was called ayes: Miller, Engstrom, Malcom, and Moore. Nays: None. Carried 4:0.

4. Heshy Rubashkin requested relief from high water bill at 251 E. Williams stated a valve had been on in the basement for several days before it was discovered by a plumber. Per City policy since the water usage entered the sewer system the city will not reduce billing, a payment plan was offered for the high bill.

5. Nuisance Abatement 215 S Lawler, Chaim Cyprys did not appear at the meeting, bill is owed for nuisance abatement.

6. Chris Hackman, City Wastewater Operator addressed some issues with the lift stations per the annual inspection of Electric Pump. Nordhaus Lift Station replacement of rings; Norplex Lift Station Pump #1 has a seal leak replacement in the amount of \$6,887- Electric Pump. Lange Lift Station power cables were found grounded, the control panel estimated at 50 years old needs replacement – recommendation to purchase new control panel and associated installation from Electric Pump Co in the amount of \$20,919. Council Member Moore made a motion to approve the purchases per the operator's recommendations for the lift stations. Seconded by Miller. Carried 4:0.

7. Discussion was held on the Collection System, we have seen a large increase in flushable wipes on the lines when attached to large grease cause blockage to the sewer lines. It was recommended by the operator to look at doing additional cleaning and televising with 60,000 linear feet of sewer line on a five year rotation to change that to every year alternating each side of town. A proposal will be put together for council review at the November meeting. The city sewer jet which was purchased used in '92 needs to be addressed with changes to the schedule on the capital improvement plan, estimated cost of a sewer jet on a trailer \$63,164.
