ORDINANCE NO. 695-24**

**ORDINANCE NO. 695-24
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING
CHAPTER 15 (MAYOR) AND
CHAPTER 17 (COUNCIL) OF THE
POSTVILLE, IOWA CODE OF
ORDINANCES**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
POSTVILLE, IOWA:**

SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to amend certain provisions of Chapters 15 and 17 of the Postville Code of Ordinances to bring the compensation levels for the Mayor and City Council more into line with similarly situated cities in Iowa.

SECTION 2. SECTIONS AMENDED. Chapters 15 and 17 are hereby amended as follows, with underlined text indicating language added and struck through language indicating removal:

**CHAPTER 15
MAYOR**

15.04 COMPENSATION. The salary of the Mayor is twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) three thousand six-hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$3,625.00) per year. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 372.13)

**CHAPTER 17
COUNCIL**

17.06 COMPENSATION. The salary of each Council member is thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each meeting of the Council attended. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 372.13)

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law. PASSED AND APPROVED this 8 day of April, 2024.

There will need to be a public hearing since it does not meet the requirements for paving without the hearing. DEFINITIONS

- Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) – The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.
- Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) – The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.
- ppb – parts per billion.
- ppm – parts per million.
- pCi/L – picocuries per liter
- N/A – Not applicable
- ND – Not detected
- RAA – Running Annual Average
- Treatment Technique (TT) – A required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.
- Action Level (AL) – The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.
- Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.
- Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.
- SGL – Single Sample Result
- RTCR – Revised Total Coliform Rule
- NTU – Nephelometric Turbidity Units

GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water posed a health risk. More information about contaminants or potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. ADDITIONAL HEALTH INFORMATION

Infants and young children are typically more vulnerable to lead in drinking water than the general population. If you are concerned about elevated lead levels in your home's water, you may wish to have your water tested and flush your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using tap water. OTHER VIOLATIONS

In July 2023 we failed to monitor for Coliform Bacteria. Adverse health effects, if any, are not known. Monitoring procedures have been corrected to avoid future violations.

SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

This water supply obtains its water from the dolomite and sandstone of the Cambrian-Ordovician aquifer. The Cambrian-Ordovician aquifer was determined to have low susceptibility to contamination because the characteristics of the aquifer and overlying materials provide natural protection from contaminants at the land surface. The Cambrian-Ordovician wells will have low susceptibility to surface contaminants such as leaking underground storage tanks, contaminant spills, and excess fertilizer application. A detailed evaluation of your source water was completed by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources, and is available from the Water Operator at 563-379-9341.
