ORDINANCE NO. 704-25
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING
CHAPTER 41 OF THE CODE OF
ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF
POSTVILLE, IOWA, AMENDING
PROVISIONS RELATED TO
FIREWORKS

WHEREAS, the Iowa Legisla-
ture recently amended Iowa Code
Chapter 364.2, subsection 6, to
read as follows:

"A City Council may by ordinance
or resolution prohibit or limit the
use of consumer fireworks, display
fireworks, or novelties, as described
in section 727.2, on any day other
than July 3, July 4, and Decem-
ber 31 in accordance with section
727.2, subsection 4."

WHEREAS, the City of Postville,
Iowa City Code is currently more
restrictive than the State Code, as
amended above, and for that rea-
son must be amended, as the City
Code cannot prohibit behavior or
activities specifically authorized by
the State Code.

Be it, therefore, ordained by the
Council of the City of Postville,
Iowa, as follows:

Section 1: Section 41.14 of the City
of Postville City Code, is hereby re-
pealed in its entirety and replaced
as follows:

41.14 FIREWORKS.

1. It is unlawful for any person or en-
tity to use or explode any consumer
fireworks, including first-class con-

sumer fireworks and second-class
consumer fireworks as defined in
Section 10A.519(1) of the *Code of
Iowa*, subject to the following ex-
ception:

A. Consumer Fireworks as de-
scribed within Iowa Code Sections
727.2 may be used on July 3, July
4, and December 31, without re-
striction or other condition by any
person or entity but for the terms
and provisions set forth within Iowa
Code Section 727.2(4).

2. It is unlawful to use or explode
any Display Fireworks, as defined
in Section 727.2 of the *Code of
Iowa*, subject to the following ex-
ceptions:

A. Display fireworks may be used or
exploded without a permit at any in-
corporated county fair or any district
fair receiving state aid.

B. Display fireworks may be used or
exploded by a City agency or
department, a fair association, an
amusement park, or other orga-
nization, group of individuals, or
individual, upon the receipt of an
application in writing and the ap-
proval of same by the City Council
which shall include a finding that
the person/entity responsible for
the use of the Display Fireworks is a
competent operator. No permit shall
be granted hereunder unless the
competent operator or sponsoring
person or entity has filed evidence
of insurance with the City, with the

following minimum limits.

(1) Personal Injury: \$250,000.00
per person.

(2) Property Damage: \$50,000.00.

(3) Total Exposure: \$1,000,000.00.

C. Display Fireworks as described
within Iowa Code Sections 727.2
may be used on July 3, July 4, and
December 31, without restriction or
other condition by any person or en-
tity but for the terms and provisions
set forth within Iowa Code Section
727.2(4).

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of
ordinances in conflict with this ordi-
nance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. If any section, provision
or part of this ordinance shall be
adjudged invalid or unconstitutional,
such adjudication shall not affect
the validity of the ordinance as a
whole or any section, provision or
part thereof not adjudged invalid or
unconstitutional.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be
in effect after its final passage, ap-
proval and publication as provided
by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 703-25
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING
CHAPTER 69 (PARKING REGU-
LATIONS) OF THE CITY CODE
OF ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY
COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
POSTVILLE, IOWA:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The pur-
pose of this ordinance is to amend
certain provisions of Chapter 69,
Section 69.08 of the City Code to
prohibit parking near the transition
corner between Walnut Drive and
Lilac Lane as parked cars make vis-
ibility difficult and traversing the cor-
ner hazardous. The City Council for
the City of Postville, Iowa has deter-
mined that this prohibition is neces-
sary to protect the health and safety
of the citizens of Postville and is au-
thorized by section 321.236 of the
Iowa Code (2025).

SECTION 2. SECTIONS AMEND-
ED. The following sections of Chap-
ter 69 are amended with underlined
language reflecting new language.

CHAPTER 69 - PARKING
REGULATIONS

SECTION 69.08 NO PARKING
ZONES

No one shall stop, stand or park
a vehicle in any of the following
specifically designated no parking
zones except when necessary to
avoid conflict with other traffic or

in compliance with the direction
of a peace officer or traffic control
signal.

...
32. Walnut Drive on the south side
from the western edge of the drive-
way at 540 Walnut Lane continuing
to Lilac Lane on the east side to the
southern edge of the driveway at
402 Lilac Lane.

All other portions of section 69.08
remain unchanged.

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All or-
dinances or parts of ordinances
in conflict with this ordinance are
hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If
any section, provision or part of this
ordinance shall be adjudged invalid
or unconstitutional, such adjudica-
tion shall not affect the validity of
the ordinance as a whole or any
section, provision, or part thereof
not adjudged invalid or constitu-
tional.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.
This ordinance shall be in effect af-
ter its final passage, approval and
publication as provided by law.
